- 1. Follow a routine plan your day
- 2. Set ground rules within your household establish roles
- 3. Find a suitable space to work
- 4. Stay active make time to exercise
- Get dressed
- 6. Email is not always the answer
- 7. Don't be a news junkie
- 8. Take control of the things you can
- 9. Stay connected maintain social contacts
- 10. Reflect on working life



10 tips for managing remote teams

- 1. Put safety first
- 2. Know when to step away from your desk set an example
- 3. Minimise stress set expectations for communication
- 4. Have a virtual daily huddle
- 5. Foster relationships
- 6. Show the big picture but be prepared to flex
- 7. Set expectations and trust your colleagues
- 8. Be kind
- 9. Discourage presenteeism
- 10. Offer support on well-being
